1 Board 05-2019 : Decision at Beirut

Each WG need to revise its objective for 2020-2022. They will be consolidated at corporate level and will be validated during the October Board with the possible impacts.

A general note consolidating the actions plan and the reports of the Beirut meetings will be sent to each member of each WG by the General Secretary.

2 OGA 05-2019 : Orientations 2019 – 2020 validated

The main axis is the revival and the dynamics of the FISUEL following a sad 2018 year for the balance sheet and the work of the GTA.

The main orientations of the Fisuel are:

2.1 Maintain present members

The added value of Fisuel (Why Joint Fisuel to be reviewed by Marc Maslowski) needs to be better explained in ways that increase motivation.

Involve the members and make a very good GAM 2019 with sharing and exchange between members and guests to create the dynamism of previous years in recognition still strong internationally.

2.2 Research new members

The sectors defined by Fisuel are residential and non-residential

In the budget it is expected to find 6 new members in 2019 in addition to the current members.

2.3 Balance the accounts

All members must pay their fees by the due date stipulated in the statutes. It was normally according to Article 11, to be up to date at the general assembly. This point will be specified by the treasurer at the time of the 2019 budget.

It is proposed to raise the reserve fund from € 51,000 to € 80,000 in 3 years

2.4 Diversify activities contributing to electrical safety

The Board of Directors wants all the criteria to be properly developed for the residential and non-residential sectors

- Best practice national and international, communication all types, testimonies
- Initial and periodic controls
- Renewable energy, access to electricity
- Statistics, measurement, detection, maintenance,
- but also qualification, experience
- market surveillance, fight against unfair products, etc.

We have many criteria to explore and for which examples exist somewhere.

2.5 Consolidate the international image of Fisuel

We have launched a new website that we hope will be more communicative and more dynamic. The opening is scheduled for the end of 2019

It is planned to extend the Safetybarometer site to non-residential

The next GAM2020 must be as efficient and effective as that of Abidjan and of Beirut as a place of exchange
Twitter Fisuel must be dynamic and relayed by regional twitters.

The global recipient network of the newsletter needs to be strengthened

It is planned to strengthen our partnership agreements with IEC / IECEE, Cenelec and ESF

It is envisaged to create a Fisuel Wikipedia page

2.6 Mastering electrical safety diagnosis in the 3 regions

4.2.2 WGAP 2018 Action Plan

- Theme: WGAP aimed to promote FISUEL to Asia & Pacific countries in 2018
- Purpose: To consolidate WG's cooperation and to discuss inviting new members
- Member of WGAP in 2018: Active & Associated Members
 - ALPERKLINAS(Indonesia), COTSUEL (New Caledonia),
 - EC(Malaysia), FESIA(Japan), KESCO(Korea), KONSUIL(Indonesia)
- Planned Activities
 - Q1: Workshop with Africa WG and KESCO. Promoting FISUEL to Viet Nam in Ministers meeting
 - Q2: Taking part in GAM 2018 in Ivory Coast. Holding an WGAP meeting as a part of FISUEL big event
 - Q3: Promoting FISUEL to Mongolia Government. Reinforcing FESIA's survey dispatched to the WGAP member. Having a meeting between ESIAs and KESCO in Japan
 - Q4: Taking part in ASEAN meeting in Singapore

4.2.3 Shared Information in the WGAP meeting

- KONSUIL cited the World Bank to explain the situation in Indonesia. KONSUIL emphasized WGAP's cooperation in strengthening the electricity-related issues, which ranked third among the 10 indicators based on the World Bank. And Indonesia government will organize the delicate made of 6 organization including KONSUIL to take part in the next GAM
- COTSUEL briefed on electricity problems in New Caledonia.
In New Caledonia, about 60% of the population is in compliance with the Common Rule, while the remaining 40% are under customary rule. As part of strengthening cooperation between WGAP members, if COTSUEL has the necessary data on electrical safety, it will upload the questions to the dropbox and the remaining members will share the answer to the question in the dropbox.
- FESIA shared the way how to protect the inspectors during the site inspection and the materials will be uploaded to dropbox.
- FESIA suggested that opening the dropbox data to not only its members but also major electrical safety agencies in the Asia-Pacific region to encourage non-members to promote FISUEL and join FISUEL.
- KESCO introduced the Energy Safety Forum will be held in Singapore in conjunction with ASEAN annual meeting

4.2.4 Safety Barometer

- Safety Barometer can be used to compare with many countries electrical safety status
- The data showing on the web-site should be updated with current data
- Updating non-member's data is not easy, and it is likely that each member's own network can be used to deliver the survey to non-members and keep the data up-to-date

4.3.1 GAM 2017 Bali

KONSUIL and ALPERKLINAS are promoting to government & related organization in Indonesia. Ministry of Energy & Mineral Resources Republic of Indonesia will support this event. Each member is going to share and the information about GAM 2017 Bali with related organization and to encourage participation in each country.

ICA in Indonesia and KONSUIL had a meeting regarding this event and they will attend the event after internal discuss. Around 20 members of FESIA will participate in GAM 2017 Bali for supporting Asia/Pacific WG member. HIOKI as the FESIA member has become sponsor of the event.

- KONSUIL had met the director of technical electricity to request a support of Indonesian government for FISUEL event.
- KONSUIL, KESCO(Korea) & EC(Malaysia) consolidated information on the Energy Safety Management System Project
- KONSUIL & COOPER ALLIANCE had produced a public information film

4.3.3 Asia/Pacific WG meeting on second half year

We need to boost WG meeting with obvious and specific agenda. We can make the meeting event fruitful with site visit or attending other event like seminar, forum, conference regarding electrical safety field.

4.3.4 Invite new member or regional expert

KONSUIL suggested that LCPPT, Shandong Licun Power Plant Technology (CHINA) join FISUEL and they are considering about it and request more information.

- Reporting violation of laws and regulations regarding electricity or to the international institution and electricity consumer protection.
- Accompany and advocating the consumer, if they have violation laws issues regarding consumer protection.

Le mercredi 01 mai 2019 à 10 heures précises au Kempinski Summerland Hotel Beirut, Monsieur Jean Claude KOUASSI, Président du Groupe de Travail Afrique (GTA) de la Fédération Internationale pour la Sécurité des Usagers de l'Electricité (FISUEL), par ailleurs Directeur Général de LBTP – Côte d'Ivoire, a présidé la séance de travail relative à l'objet repris en marge.

Etaient présentes, les personnes dont les noms figurent dans la liste de présence ci-jointe.

L'ordre du jour a porté sur les points ci-après:

- mot d'ouverture du président de séance ;
- informations générales sur le GTA ;
- Organisation du Plan d'Action 2019 du GTA ;
- recommandations ;
- questions diverses.

5.1.1 Mot d'ouverture du président de séance

Dans son propos liminaire le président de séance a souhaité la bienvenue aux participants. Il a indiqué que la présente séance de travail a pour objectif de redynamiser le GAT au sein de la fédération après un passage à vide au cours de l'année 2018. Il est question de rassembler autour d'une même table l'ensemble des parties prenantes au Groupe de Travail, afin que l'Afrique puisse parler d'une seule voix au sein de la FISUEL. Par la suite, il a précisé qu'il est urgent que l'Afrique retrouve sa place d'antan au sein de la Fédération, notamment celle marquée par son dynamisme, afin de trouver une solution concertée à la sécurisation de l'approvisionnement en énergie électrique et à la sécurité des biens et des utilisateurs de l'électricité. Le Président de séance a terminé son propos en félicitant la délégation Camerounaise pour son brillant exposé au cours du symposium.

5.1.2 Informations générales sur le GTA

A la suite du président de séance, la parole a été donnée à Monsieur Mamadou SYLLA, Directeur du Département SECUREL au sein de LBTP-Côte d'Ivoire pour donner quelques informations sur la situation du GTA. A l'issue de son exposé, il ressort ce qui suit :

- trois (03) délégations venant du continent ont répondu présentes à l'Assemblée Générale Annuelle de la fédération à Bierut au Liban :
 - la délégation du Sénégal représentée par ELHADJI MALICK de SENELEC et PROQUELEC ;
 - la délégation de Côte d'Ivoire conduite par M. Jean Claude KOUASSI, Directeur Général de LBTP, assisté de M. Mamadou SYLLA, Directeur du Département SECUREL de LBTP ;
 - la délégation du Cameroun composée de M. Serge Guy GUIENTSING OLAGA, Ingénieur Chef de Service à l'ARSEL et de M. Patrice BENDE, Direction Adjointe Sécurité Environnement et Responsabilité Sociétale de ENEO ;
- les autres Membres de la région Afrique de la Fédération n'ont pas pu effectuer le déplacement pour des raisons de difficulté d'obtention de visa ;
- conformément à la dernière réunion du GTA tenue en Côte d'Ivoire en avril-mai 2018 :
 - M. Désiré NANSI, Vice-Président de la FISUEL ;
 - M. Jean Claude KOUASSI est maintenu Président du GTA ;
 - le Secrétariat Général du GTA reste assuré par Technologie Zentrum du Cameroun ;
- M. Serge Guy GUIENTSING OLAGA de ARSEL-Cameroun a assuré le secrétariat de la présente séance du GTA ;
- tous les Présidents des Comités Techniques Nationaux (Electrotechnique, Bureaux de Normalisation, Bureaux d'Etudes et Contrôle, etc.) pourront désormais faire l'objet d'invitation comme Experts au GTA ;

5.2.1 ACTE 1 : Réunion élargie à tous les participants Africains

Après la validation de l'ordre du jour proposé par le DG du LBTP, un tour de table a été fait pour les présentations.

La présentation du Système Qualité du LBTP a été faite par Monsieur TOUNKARA responsable Qualité. Les échanges après la présentation ont permis à la séance de comprendre l'intérêt de la mise en place d'un Système Qualité dans nos structures. Monsieur DABLE a ensuite présenté la vérification des installations électriques intérieures faite par SECUREL. Il a fait le bilan des 36 ans d'expériences du Contrôle. Cette communication a suscité des échanges fructueux, desquels nous pouvons retenir :

- Au-delà de la vérification des installations électriques intérieures avant la première mise sous tension, il faut prendre en compte le contrôle des installations existantes et le contrôle périodique.
- Des mesures à mettre en place afin de s'assurer de la conformité du matériel et le niveau de responsabilité des agents en charge de la vérification
- Le niveau de responsabilité des installateurs électriens.

L'expérience de Mayotte n'a pu être visionnée pour cause d'indisponibilité de la vidéo.

Après la prise du décret rendant obligatoire le contrôle, le Sénégal est en attente d'arrêtés d'application.

Le Cameroun n'a toujours pas de texte rendant obligatoire le contrôle pour des raisons de lourdeur administrative, selon M. FOTSO d'ARSEL.

- Organisation d'un GTA à Abidjan pour l'élaboration d'une méthodologie de mise en sécurité des Marchés pour l'Afrique (**réalisée**)
- Visite à l'UEMOA à Ouagadougou en Juillet 2018, budgétisé à 1 000 000 FCFA.
- Visite à la CEDEAO à Abuja en Septembre 2018, budgétisé à 1 000 000 F FCFA.
- Visite au MALI à l'ACAVIE en Septembre 2018, budgétisé à 1 000 000 F CFA
- Organisation d'un GTA au Cameroun ou dans un autre pays.

Le LNBTP à travers son Directeur Général a souhaité organiser un symposium sur la sécurité électrique au TOGO, une date sera proposée à cet effet.

Le LBTP a été commis de rencontrer le Ministre des Infrastructures Economiques de la Côte d'Ivoire à l'effet de faire un lobbying auprès de l'UEMOA en vue d'obtenir une contribution financière.

Il a été enregistré les manifestations d'intérêt de 3 potentiels membres du GTA, il s'agit de l'ACAVIE du MALI, du LNBTP du TOGO et de DIAKELEC de la GUINÉE CONAKRY.

5.3.2 *Objectives*

GTA's members meet each year on a rotation basis, in one of their respective countries of residence, with electricity sector players. A meeting may be held in a non-member organization's country, depending on its interest in FISUEL's activities for a future membership purpose. The main objective of these meetings is to create, promote, sustain and improve relationship between experts and particularly to share experiences and best practices regarding electrical safety. These days should allow the authorities of countries without any inspection system to be aware of the emergency of getting one and above all to make it mandatory to control the electrical installations, before their first power-up.

These exchanges should also enable participants to mutualize their efforts in the fight against electrical material counterfeiting.

5.3.3 *Activities*

The Cotonou meeting has been GTA's main activity this year. CONTRELEC which made its comeback at FISUEL in 2014 has been selected to host the GTA 2017.

For the record, there is a new Managing Director at the head of CONTRELEC namely Mr. SAIZONOU Mohamed Masmoudi who is replacing Mr. Clément Bill AKOUEDENOUDJÉ

The Cotonou GTA took place from March 13th to March 14th 2017 at "BENIN ROYAL HOTEL"

The following milestones were covered during this two days event at Cotonou:

- The Opening Ceremony

It has been presided by His Excellency (H.E.) **Dona Jean-Claude HOUSSOU, Minister of Energy, Mines and Water of Benin**; As part of the organization of a GTA, it is the first time that a minister of the hosting country participates to the event. That illustrates the importance placed by the Beninese government to electrical safety problematic.

CONTRELEC, particularly its Managing Director has to be congratulated for this initiative.

The absence of FENELEC at this ceremony has been noted by its peers.

- The Forum

It was about the general thematic: « **ELECTRICITY USERS SAFETY IN GTA'S MEMBER STATES: CURRENT SITUATION AND PROSPECTS** ».

All the attending GTA's members made a communication on the topic.

The communications enabled participants to be informed on the current situation of the policy led in the regulatory framework, instituting the respect of electrical specification in accordance with each member country's requirements.

■ GTA'S Technical meeting

The topics proposed for being examined were grouped into three panels as per the agenda agreed.

PANEL 1 : Recommendations of the ordinary general assembly last session held in Marrakech (Morocco) in 2016 :
Execution report, GTA specific problems and proposed solutions

- **The development of a data collection strategy for electrical accidents assigned to GTA.** Mr. Benoit Dôme committed to deliver an information collection template.
- **Assign to GTA the task of leading a plea towards governments and sub-regional organizations in order to generalize the mandatory control of electrical equipment and installations**
- **Set up electrical equipment quality control infrastructures in countries.** Establishment of an ad hoc committee to contact sub-regions competent authorities (UEMOA and CEMAC) in order to propose strategies and mechanisms of fights against counterfeit electrical materials.
- **Encourage States to strengthen distribution networks and to facilitate social connections.**
- **Promote support initiatives for network extension and connections in peri-urban areas.** Both of these issues will be covered at the next GTA due to their complexity to influence decision makers.

PANEL 2 : Review of GTA important concerns

- The operationalization of the Memorandum of understanding signed May 2016 between the KOREAN ELECTRIC SAFETY CORPORATION (KESCO) and the GTA. GTA should submit to KESCO the approved training modules. A meeting is scheduled for this purpose on the fringes of the Bali OGA.
- The reinforcement of the convention between PROMOTELEC and GTA. GTA should contact the Director of PROMOTELEC in Bali in order to make the convention more dynamic.
- AFRICA'S Candidacy for organizing FISUEL Ordinary general assembly (OGA) in 2018. Côte d'Ivoire and Benin are candidates for hosting the 2018 OGA (GAM 2018).

PANEL 3 : Review of the final terms for Bali symposium and GTA's contribution

If the schedule allows, Côte d'Ivoire will propose to deliver a presentation on the topic: « Electricity program for all »;
NB : Each presentation should be a significant contribution of GTA to the Bali Symposium through its content.

5.3.4 CONCLUSION

At the end of the 2017 GTA organized in Cotonou, it appears that:

This experiences exchange meeting has been rewarding for FISUEL GTA's members and above all for the electricity sector players.

Moreover, CONTRELEC, as the GTA's hosting country Regulator, has been commended for its ability to mobilize the resources necessary for the successful organization of these meetings.

GTA's members were received in audience by Mr. Dona Jean-Claude HOUSOU, Minister of Energy of the Republic of Benin. They took this opportunity to express their deep gratitude to the Beninese ministerial authority, and through it, all the Government of Benin led by its Chief, President Patrice TALON.

Two important resolutions of the Cotonou meeting were presented to the Minister.

- The first is related to the promotion of the intended training as part of the convention with the South Korean group **Korean Electric Security Corporation (KESCO)**.
- The second is about the electrical security problematic and the respect of the electrical installations security standards by the economic integration sub-regional and regional institutions such as UEMOA, CEMAC,... to establish a community integrated mechanism for the fight against non-compliant electrical materials, of poor

quality, and often from counterfeiting and smuggling; But also for a strategy and common actions for monitoring the internal market in these community spaces.

The Minister welcomed these initiatives and gave the assurance of his commitment to provide all the necessary support. He asked the Managing Director of CONTRELEC to make concrete initiatives propositions to the UEMOA Energy Commission President; to envisage, if necessary some top-level meetings with authorities and competent structures in order to achieve this objective that is extremely important to him.
